#### 2. Locations

Sierra Leone – Freetown. Other locations in Sierra Leone are also desirable.

## 3. Sector(s) and area(s) of specialization

The planned activities are linked with the reintegration interventions designed for supporting returning migrants. IOM Sierra Leone is seeking an Implementing Partner in the form of a <u>non-profit</u> non-governmental, governmental, service provider or private sector entity, to organize, manage and deliver Technical Vocational Educational Training (TVET) and provide start-up kits for returning migrants.

The objective of this intervention is to enhance skills of trainees (returned migrants) and increase their employability within the labour market, as well as equip them with the necessary items to ensure their livelihoods.

The sectors may include, but not limited to manufacturing goods, arts &crafts, mechanical engineering, electrical installation, agriculture/agro-processing activities, etc.

## 5. Project Background

Assisted Voluntary Return and Reintegration (AVRR) is an essential component of migration management, aiming to achieve, safe, orderly and dignified migration and also upholding the rights and dignity of migrants. Through the AVRR programmes, the International Organization for Migration (IOM):

- Contributes to promote the social and economic inclusion of all migrants, irrespective of their gender, age, race, religion, and status.
- Ensures that returning migrants are assisted immediately after their arrival.
- Aims at facilitating a sustainable reintegration of returning migrants into the community by providing tailored assistance and ensuring their access to social, economic and psychosocial assistance.

IOM Sierra Leone is currently implementing the Migrant Protection, Return and Reintegration Programme for Sub-Saharan Africa (MPRR-SSA), a European Union (EU) – IOM Joint Initiative that enable migrants who decide to return to their home countries to restart their lives through an integrated approach. This is done by among other things, providing reintegration assistance to returning migrants.

The project aims to initiate innovative and sustainable reintegration models by supporting returning migrants to reach self-sufficiency, social and psychosocial well-being that allow them to become more resilient. This initiative is also working towards working across several levels – individual, households, and communities. Consequently, IOM seeks to engage both governments, private, and TVET institutions in Freetown and other districts across Sierra Leone to create more opportunities for returned migrants to enhance their ongoing economic assistance, particularly migrants that have an interest in small-scale business and in job placement or internships/mentorship opportunities.

## 6. Expected Results

This intervention will target a number of **276 returnees** who will be selected through an established screening process performed in agreement with IOM. All training courses need to be completed by latest 30/06/2024. The duration of each training curriculum is ideally up to **4 months** (maximum 100 working days) and should not exceed 6 hours per day. Training is generally provided during morning hours and end shortly after lunch. All trainings shall include:

- The provision of participants screening, prior to the commencement of the training to assess their level of skills and professional inclinations.
- A toolkit /training materials to support the trainees during their learning process and for practicing their skills.
- Life-skills sessions, including basic business knowledge, resume writing, interview skills among others.

Programmes that include apprenticeships, internships, on-the job training, professional mentorship, career planning and guidance are highly desirable.

#### 7. Indicative Budget

The applicants are requested to prepare and submit the budget proposal as per Annex E-Budget template.

#### 8. Other Information

8.1. The selected "Implementing Partner(-s)" shall perform the Activities according to the Terms of Reference (Annex A of this Document).

The engagement between IOM and the Implementing Partner shall be further covered with a Project Implementation Agreement using the Project Implementation Agreement template (Annex G) after final confirmation of project implementation.

#### 9. Selection Criteria

The evaluation of the applications received will be performed as follows:

# I. Preliminary evaluation of the proposals (pass/fail criteria)

The below eligibility requirements will be taken into consideration for each applicant with a pass or fail criteria before undertaking the evaluation of the financial and technical proposal. The Applicant must attain the rating of "pass" in all areas to proceed with the technical evaluation.

This document contains instructions on the preparation and submission of the Application.

- 1. The Application must be submitted through email to <a href="mailto:iomfreetown@iom.int">iomfreetown@iom.int</a> no later than 31 October 2023, 23:59 local time. Late Application will no longer be considered.
- 2. A detailed description must be provided on how the requirements specified in the Call for Expression of Interest (CEI) issued by IOM will be matched by the capabilities, experience, knowledge and expertise of the Implementing Partners.
- 3. The email subject shall be indicated with the **reference number SL/MPRR/September/CEI-01** and the name of the Applicant.
- 4. The Application must be submitted in the English language and in the format prescribed by IOM within the CEI. All required information must be provided, responding clearly and concisely to all the points set out. Any application which does not fully and comprehensively address this CEI requirements may be rejected.
- 5. The Application document should comprise of the following:

- a. Cover Letter;
- b. Duly completed application documentation as outlined within the CEI signed on all pages by the prospective Implementing Partner's Authorized Representative; and
- c. Any other relevant documents
- 6. Applications may be modified or withdrawn in writing, prior to the closing time specified in this Request for EoI. Applications shall not be modified or withdrawn after the deadline.
- 7. The Implementing Partner shall bear all costs associated with the preparation and submission of the Application and IOM will not in any case be responsible and liable for the costs incurred.
- 8. IOM at no occasion, will ask an application fee from Implementing Partners.
- 9. Partners can use IOM's We Are All In platform for reporting fraud, corruption or misconduct.
- 10. All information given in writing to or verbally shared with the Implementing Partners in connection with this CEI is to be treated as strictly confidential.
